H.B. 224	<p style="text-align: center;">County Government Change Election Amendments</p> <p>This bill: reorganizes and recodifies Title 17, Chapter 52, Changing Forms of County Government; combines sections with similar subject matter; amends definitions; amends provisions related to the appointment of certain members of an appointment council; prohibits a county of the second class that initiates the process of changing the county's form of government from proposing to retain, revert to, or change to a three-member commission form of government; prohibits a person from initiating a process to change a county's form of government when a process to change the county's form of government is pending; requires that registered voters who wish to initiate the process to change a county's form of government file a notice of intent to gather signatures; establishes a deadline by which the sponsors of a petition to create a study committee are required to file the petition; removes a provision that requires an optional plan to be approved by the county legislative body or subjected to a petition before the optional plan is submitted to the voters; requires a county clerk to post an optional plan on the county's website for a specified period of time before an election on the optional plan; provides that an optional plan is adopted if approved by a majority of voters that vote on the optional plan; provides for the appointment of a chair of a study committee; requires a study committee to submit a report to the county clerk; provides that if a study committee recommends that the form of a county's government not change, the process to change the county's form of government is concluded; establishes a deadline after which an optional plan may not be repealed without initiating a new process to change the county's form of government; removes obsolete and superfluous provisions; and makes technical and conforming changes.</p>	Rep. 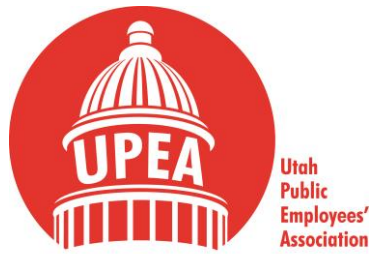

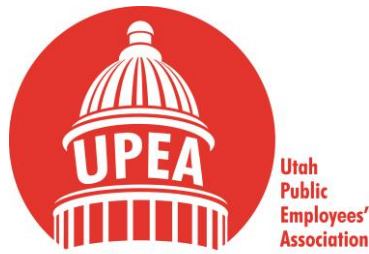

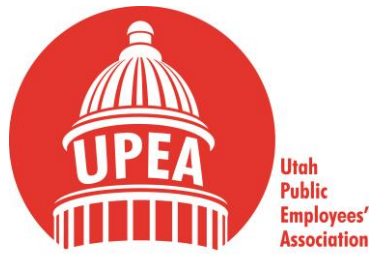
